MISSION TRIP APPLICATION

Instructions: Please **TYPE** answers to every question by attaching a sheet with your answers and hand them both in. The Student Ministry Mission Trip is a serious endeavor, it is not a vacation! Therefore, the ministry will only take the individuals who exhibit Christ-likeness, meet the requirements listed on this application, and completed the application in full. This application and requirements are meant to be done exclusively by the student with no help or assistance from anyone else including parents, guardians, family, and/or friends. Return the application as soon as it is completed to the Student Pastor. You will be notified whether your application is accepted or denied after all requirements are completed. If you have questions about the application or the process, the student may ask the Student Pastor for explanations.

Requirements:

1. Complete Mission Trip Application
2. Serve at VBS as a volunteer (if unavailable for VBS week, serve at two other ministry events approved by Student Pastor)
3. Short Letter of Reference (Non-Family Member) from a boss/leader that knows your work ethic, and submit it with application
4. Approval from Student Pastor

Questions:

1. Why do you want to go on the Mission Trip?
2. What is the purpose of a Mission Trip?
3. What do you hope to learn, accomplish, or get from going on the Mission Trip?
4. Why do you think Mission Trips are important?
5. If you were leading a Mission Trip and leading a group of teenagers how would you like them to act, behave, and treat others on the trip?
6. Describe how you came to faith in Christ.
7. What is your favorite Bible verse?
8. Why is that your favorite Bible verse?
9. For an entire week (7 days) read at least a chapter in the Bible each day. Journal each day and in at least a paragraph say what it is about, what does it mean, and what does the passage teach you about God, about yourself, or about others. (NOTE: It will help to pick chapters in the Bible that are consecutive. If you choose to read 2 or 3 John, you must read 1 John as well. The book of Jude counts as 1 chapter. If you choose to do 7 chapters in Psalms, they must be consecutive Psalms.)
10. Describe one major thing you learned about the Bible, God, or yourself after reading the Bible consistently for one entire week.
